Top Row — 1. "Carolina" or "Inverness", U.S. Glass Co., Pittsburgh, mug, 4 inches high. 2. "Frazier" cream pitcher, 3¼ inches high. 3. "Chippendale", marked "KrysTol" after 1906, made by Ohio Flint Glass Co., Lancaster, Ohio, open sugar, pressed handles, 3¾ inches high. 4. "Checkerboard" or "Bridal Rosettes" with gilt, cream pitcher, 3¾ inches high. 5. "New Hampshire" or "Bent Buckle" or "Modiste" open sugar, 2¾ inches high. 6. "Wellington" spoonholder or vase, 3¾ inches high. 7. "Spearpoint Band" cream pitcher, 4½ inches high.

Second Row — 1. "Holbrook" spoonholder, 4½ inches high. 2. "Diamond Point Disks" tumbler, 3¾ inches high. 3. "Pigmy" or "Torpedo" tumbler, 4½ inches high. 4. "Diamond and Sunburst, Variant" tumbler, 3¾ inches high. 5. "Duncan's No. 40" tumbler, 3¾ inches high. 6. "English Late Cherry" tumbler, 4 inches high, obviously used for packing Cherry jam as is marked "9 oz. Av.". 7. "Late Strawberry Variant" tumbler, 3¾ inches high, clear top, red bottom. 8. "Late Strawberry Variant" tumbler, 3¾ inches high, red top, clear bottom, marked "8 oz. Av.". 9. "Era" or "New Era" spoonholder, 4½ inches high.

Third Row — 1. "Beaded Dart Band" goblet, 5¾ inches high. 2. "Diamond Splendor" wine, 4½ inches high. 3. "Hildago" or "Frosted Waffle" goblet, 5½ inches high. 4. "X-Logs" or "Prism Arc" wine, 4½ inches high. 5. "Yoked Loop" or "Scalloped Yoke" goblet, 6½ inches high. 6. "Knight" wine, 4¼ inches high. 7. "Yoked Loop" etched, goblet, 6½ inches high. 8. "Maryland" or "Inverted Loop and Fan" wine, 4¼ inches high. 9. "Texas" or "Loop with Stippled Panels" goblet, 6½ inches high. 10. "Crossed Ovals" wine, 3½ inches high. 11. "Bismarc Star" goblet, 6¼ inches high.

Fourth Row — 1. "Star of Bethlehem" with gilt, sauce, 2 inches high. 2. "Japanese Iris" with gilt, sauce, 2¾ inches high. 3. "Minnesota" oval sauce, 2¼ inches high. 4. "Helene" sauce, 1¾ inches high. 5. "Box-in-Box" sauce, 2 inches high.

Fifth Row — 1. "Heisey No. 1200" miniature open sugar, 2¾ inches high. 2. "Famous" toothpick holder, 2½ inches high. 3. "Bead Swag" toothpick holder, 2½ inches high. 4. "Colorado" footed toothpick holder, 2¾ inches high. 5. "Stippled Bar" handled relish, 2½ inches high. 6. "Cordova" vase, 3¾ inches high. 7. "The Prize" toothpick holder, 2½ inches high. 8. "Duncan's 2001" punch cup, etched, 2½ inches high.

Sixth Row — 1. "Flat Diamond Box" tumbler, 3¾ inches high. 2. "Pressed Block" wine, 4¼ inches high. 3. "Short Panelled Diamonds" goblet, 6 inches high. 4. "Late Sawtooth" wine, 3¾ inches high. 5. "Fagot" tumbler, 3¾ inches high. 6. "Michigan" tumbler, 3¾ inches high. 7. "Duncan's No. 325" tumbler, 3¾ inches high. 8. "Bevelled Diagonal Block" tumbler, 3¾ inches high. 9. "Block and Rosette" tumbler, 3¾ inches high. 10. "Haley's Comet" wine, 4 inches high. 11. "Diamond Point Band" goblet, 6 inches high. 12. "Block Band" wine, 4½ inches high. 13. "O'Hara's No. 139" tumbler, 3¾ inches high.

Bottom Row — 1. "Art" tumbler, 4 inches high. 2. "Way's Beaded Swirl Loop" berry bowl, 3¾ inches high, 9½ inches diameter. 3. "Panelled Thistle", extremely rare ruby-stained cover, with gilt, 4¼ inches diameter. 4. "Plume and Block" berry bowl, 3½ inches high, 7¼ inches diameter. 5. "Nail" or "Recessed Pillar" goblet, 6¾ inches high. 6. "Nail" sauce, 1¾ inches high. 7. "Nail" berry bowl, etched, 3¼ inches high, 8¼ inches diameter. 8. "Greensburg Winona" tumbler, 3¾ inches high.
