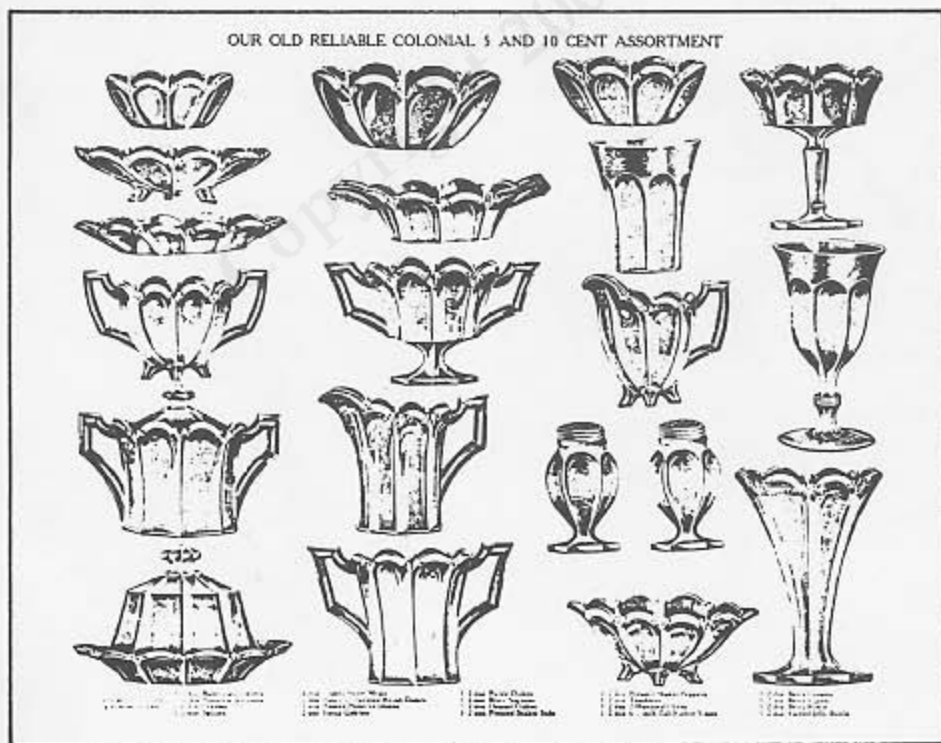

Q7—Assortment of souvenir items from 1910 Butler Bros. catalogue. Included here are a variety of patterns and novelties from various factory locations, indicating their decoration by a private firm. The lettering on most appear to have a common origin. At the bottom left and top right of the assortment are a creamer and sugar in QUADRUPED, a look-alike possibly designed to compete with the popular CHIPPENDALE pattern. Also note the INVERTED STRAWBERRY (VARIANT) tumbler, which may or may not have been a Cambridge product. It could be a copy be a competitor.
